ABOUT THE COALITION

The Community Power Coalition of New Hampshire (CPCNH or Coalition) is an all-requirements Joint Powers Agency incorporated as a government instrumentality and non-profit on October 1st, 2021, to provide for the launch and operation of Community Power Aggregations (CPAs) on behalf of participating Members.

The Coalition is governed "by communities, for communities," empowering towns, cities and counties across New Hampshire to:

- ✓ Streamline the process for authorizing a Community Power program locally.
- ✓ Share services and staff support across member cities, towns and counties.
- ✓ Participate in joint power solicitations and local project development opportunities.
- ✓ Share knowledge and collaborate regionally on clean energy and resilient infrastructure development.
- ✓ Speak with one voice at the Legislature and Public Utilities Commission on public advocacy issues related to energy and Community Power.

Coalition Membership is open to all New Hampshire cities, towns, counties and regionally operated Community Power Aggregations.

There are no upfront costs to join the Coalition. The expense of launching and operating each Member's Community Power program will be repaid after program launch — through the electricity rates set by each Member's governing body (town select boards, city councils and county executive committees) and the revenues received from participating customers in each program.

As of April 21, 2023, the Coalition is made up of thirty-three municipal members and one county member.

Member Service Territory


CPCNH's current members represent more than 23% of New Hampshire's population. Twelve members are launching CPA service in 2023. Many more intend to launch within the next year or two. At full enrollment, CPCNH will serve ~125,000 customer accounts and provide ~1,00,000 MWh of electricity.

Over 30 additional local governments have expressed interest in joining the Coalition, which would increase representation to ~50% of New Hampshire's population. CPCNH subsequently expects relatively robust member recruitment, and the launch of dozens of new CPA programs in next two to three years.

CPCNH is positioned to become the largest default supplier of electricity in New Hampshire.

Organizational Capacity

Brian Callnan joined CPCNH as our first Chief Executive Officer in May of 2023. Mr. Callnan has a career leading power supply and project and program development for public power agencies. Most recently, Mr. Callnan served as Vice President of Power Resources & Access at NH Electric Co-op, where he managed a portfolio of wholesale contracts to achieve lower rates for customers compared to NH's investor-owned utilities. Mr. Callnan also led the Coop's roll-out of "virtual power plants" harnessing distributed batteries and electric vehicles, along with "transactive energy rates" for customers to lower power costs.
